In voting against the teachers contract I want to make two things clear:

First, this vote is not an anti-teacher vote. Teachers do great work. They're the essence of a school, because, when you strip everything away, a school is the exchange of knowledge between the teacher and the student. Everything else, from the crossing guard to the Board of Education and the Superintendent, are only there to help that exchange. Teachers are the school.

Second, our negotiating team did good and diligent work in a difficult job. In negotiating you deal with different points of view, laws, mandates, and past practices. Our negotiating team has to work within those parameters. They did that hard job to the satisfaction of most of my colleagues.

I vote against the contract because the financial burden of maintaining a viable school in troubling times is only being bourne by one segment of our community -- the taxpayers.

We are contemplating the closing of school and weighing its effect on a community. We have and probably will continue to lay off staff. We have decimated programs. We have depleted reserves. We are looking at a SIGNIFICANT tax increase.

I believe that some of the salary increases we will be giving the teachers over the next 4 years would be better spent on these pressing issues. Solve these issues; then increase salaries.

Many working people in this community won't be getting salary increases over the next 4 years. Retirees, an increasingly large segment of our population, will get a COLA but not much else. These folks are just hanging on. That's the people this vote represents.

On a broader context - our federal government is 18.1 trillion dollars in debt. Our state is the 2nd most indebted state in the union - 387 billion in obligations. It's projected that NYS is 3 years shy of its constitutional debt limit. The federal government and NYS will find a way around their problems -- print or borrow money.

Our counties, towns, and schools don't have that option.

Our county is scrambling. They're out of MOSA, privatized the nursing home, talking about closing the MVB in Oneonta. Is it enough? The property tax sale auction for 2014 was 66 properties, up from 57 the previous year. That number and trend foreshadows our underlying economic health.

The county, the towns and the schools have to deal with our financial limits. And we will. Painfully. At this time, I can't justify the salary increases the teachers will get over the next four years, given pour particular financial situation and the local economy. I regret having to vote against the contract.
