### **HALL OF DISTINCTION NOMINEES**

The Unatego Hall of Distinction Committee has selected two alumni for induction this year: World War II Army Air Corps veteran and Class of 1943 Otego High School graduate Charles Herring, Jr and Joseph Bard, a 1959 Otego graduate who recently retired from a distinguished career as educational leader.

The Unatego Hall of Distinction honors graduates of Unatego, or the previous districts of Unadilla Central and Otego Central, who have distinguished themselves during their lives. Selections were announced at the high school graduation ceremonies this June.

The ceremony honoring this year's members will take place on Friday, Jan. 25 at approximately 7:00 p.m. in the Unatego High School Gym, preceded by a meet-and-greet reception at 5:30 in the cafeteria.

Please mark your calendars and plan to honor the inductees and their families.

#### **Charles White Herring, Jr.**

Herring graduated from the Otego Central School in 1943 and soon after enlisted in the U.S. Army Air Corps, where he served with distinction as a gunner on a B-29 in the Pacific theater.

Following his discharge, Herring attended Cornell University and graduated in 1950 with a degree in agriculture and animal husbandry. He returned to Otego after college, where he owned and operated the Herring Lumber Company for the next 30 years.

Herring was also a prolific volunteer in the community, serving as a member of the Otego Volunteer Fire Department, Masonic Lodge and with the Unatego Board of Education.

#### Joseph F. Bard

Joseph Bard, a 1959 graduate of Otego Central, recently retired after 20 years as the executive director of the Pennsylvania Association of Rural and Small Schools, capping a distinguished career of more than 50 years in public service.

Following his graduation from Hartwick College in 1963, Bard went on to teach at Unatego and in Connecticut and Kentucky. He served as a college administrator in Iowa and an investigator for the New York State Department of Human Rights, as well as in the U.S. Army.

Bard chaired the National Rural Education Advocacy Council for 10 years, served as a member of the Harrisburg, Pennsylvania Board of Education and, for six years, was commissioner of basic education and deputy secretary for elementary and secondary education in the state of Pennsylvania.

### 'Fine Old Building' Gets New Lease on Life: An Update on Otego Elementary

Following a yearlong process gathering community input, the district solicited proposals from potential developers for the closed former Otego Elementary building.

Ultimately, four proposals were received and after representatives from all four entities presented ideas to the Unatego Board of Education at a public meeting, the board chose AgZeit, an indoor organic agriculture business. The purchase price of the building was \$300,000.

In addition to large-scale organic agriculture, they also envision using the building to provide living space for recently separated military veterans, a training center for veterans and other adult learners, a rural health center focused on telemedicine and a year-round farmers' market. They also hope to retain the gymnasium/auditorium for community use and turn the cafeteria and kitchen into a restaurant for community members.

AgZeit CEO Jim Dutcher is very familiar with repurposing vacant school buildings, as his business began as a start-up operation in Endicott at the former Linneaus West Elementary School. With no additional space available in that building and having a need to expand operations, Dutcher turned to the Oneonta region, where he learned of the opportunity presented in Otego from the Otsego County Industrial Development Agency.

AgZeit anticipates using green energy to run its operations in Otego, and predicts they will soon be providing fresh, organic and healthy foods on a very large scale. Total initial private investment is expected to be nearly \$4 million, with a five-year investment topping \$55 million and providing employment for more than 100 once fully operational.

Although it is sad for many in the community to see the school closed, the consensus is that people are pleased to see the building given a new lease on life and appreciate the potential for additional jobs for area residents. Closing on the property is expected to occur near the end of November.
