Unatego 'Thought Exchange'

To reach out to all stakeholders, the Unatego School District recently conducted a survey using Thought Exchange software. Participants answered questions anonymously online, then other participants saw responses and rated them according to personal importance.

There was one key question: What do you value most about Unatego and what would you like to see improved?

More than 300 teachers, community members and parents participated, along with 320-plus students in grades 5-12. Top thoughts were calculated, organized and shared with staff, students, community and the Board of Education.

Using survey results and other data, board members worked with district administrators to develop goals to help guide the district as it moves forward.

OtegO HistOrian's repOrt

It is a pleasure to introduce the Otego Historical Society to the Unatego Alumni Association. We began as a society in 1976, with a room in the Harris Memorial Library.

Today, you can find us at 6 River St. in the Historical Room, a space filled with Otego artifacts and information about Otego families. The Historical Room is open from 1 to 4 p.m. Wednesdays and from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturdays in June through August.

The following is a report of my activities as town/village historian last year:

JANUARY: Our historical society has been blessed with the generosity of Otego citizens. An example of this is the pipe organ donated by the Hyatt Family. The organ was used by Otego's Order of Odd Fellows (organized in June 1911). When they disbanded in 1969, the organ was returned to the Hyatt family.

FEBRUARY What an undertaking it was for volunteers from the historical society to begin cleaning out house on the corner of Main and Willow streets. The house was donated by Malcolm Ross and it took several months to thoroughly clean it out. Sales were held in the garage, with household furniture and items sent to auction houses. There has been interest in the house and it is in the process of being sold.

APRIL: I went to a Partners in Preservation meeting on April 21. This was sponsored by Otsego County Historical Association. They partnered with the Greater Milford Historical Association. While there, I presented a display detailing the life of Adelia Gates. Adelia was born in 1825 in Otego and led a very colorful life. I included her paintings of botanical objects from Northern Africa and the Middle East, which I photographed from a collection of her work stored in the Smithsonian Institute. A colorful tour of the Sayre House in Milford was included in the day's events.

JUNE: I worked with the Evergreen Cemetery Board to select roughly 21 headstones for restoration. We applied for and received a grant from the Department of State's Division of Cemeteries to have a company repair the stones sometime this year.

OCTOBER "Voices from the Grave" – Visitors toured the cemetery and listened to stories of Otego's historic families. We heard from Dasa Harris, Celestia Lewis, Chris Connor, Vincent Fuller, Timothy Sheldon and Tim Place. I enjoyed working on this program.

We were contacted via email by people from many areas last year, mainly seeking information about relatives having lived in Otego. I was able to assist some of the folks by research or directing them to another person.

Thanks to the officers of the Otego Historical Society: Carolee Byrnes, President; Sandra Curry, Vice President; Emily Longtin, Secretary; and Jan Lloyd, Treasurer.
